Celebrate Reading

## We read all the time!

Packaging, DVD covers, novels, newspapers, magazines, cartoons, games, computers, etc.

#### As a parent, I can...

- I create many opportunities to read in French
- I talk about the books I read, with my family and my friends
- I encourage my child to read to other people in French if possible or in another language
- I talk to my child about his or her reading choices (French texts, books and magazines at the library, the bookstore, or on the Internet)
- I offer French books or magazines as gifts
- I talk about what reading brings to us
- I know what reading topics are interesting for my child and also suggest new ones
- l encourage my child to take risks (choose more difficult books) while reading in French
- accept that my child will make mistakes while reading
- I set up an enjoyable space for my child to read in French (various types of texts and authors, comfortable and cozy areas, supervised Internet access)
- I take an active interest in my child's school assignments

# Strategic reading is...

Choosing the best way to help me better understand and interact with texts.

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Recent studies say that teaching children to use specific reading strategies improves their learning, comprehension, and enjoyment.

As a parent, I should talk to my child and use some of the following questions, regardless of my level of understanding in French:

#### **BEFORE READING**

- What are you reading today?
- Are you seated comfortably for reading?
- I Will you have enough time to finish your reading?
- Why are you reading this text?
- Does this book or text seem interesting to you and why?
- Does this text seem easy or hard for you and why?
- What do you already know about this topic, or what does it remind you of?
- What are you going to use to take notes while you read?
- What strategies have you used in the past to help you read this type of text?
- Will you need your *Référentiel*?

#### **DURING READING**

- Who could give you help if you need it?
- What tools could you use to help yourself?
- Do you remember reading that kind of text with success?
- What connections are you making between what you are reading and what you have read or experienced before?
- What are the main ideas in this text, and how did you find them?
- Is this text helping you with what you need to do?
- What strategies from your *Référentiel* can you use to help you with this particular problem?

## AFTER READING

- What did this text give you?
- How do you feel after reading this text?
- What questions did this text trigger for you?
- How will you use your notes to help you with the assignment you need to do?
- Did the strategies you use help you to better understand the text and finish your project?
- Which strategies will you be able to use in your future reading assignments?
- What conclusions do you draw from this reading experience?

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## We write often!

Birthday cards, notes, phone messages, lists, directions, reminders, course notes, etc.

#### As a parent I can...

- I take advantage of every opportunity to write in French
- I talk about the things I write
- l encourage my child to find a French-speaking pen pal
- I encourage my child to take risks (try new words, a new kind of text) while writing in French
- support him or her in finding the meaning of difficult words
- I create an exciting environment for writing (various papers, personal diary, blank cards, neat pens and pencils, computer paper with different designs, calligraphy pens, computer, French dictionary, French encyclopedias, etc.)
- I create opportunities to write in front of my child in French if possible or in my mother tongue
- I take interest in my child's homework
- l encourage my child to present his or her work in a neat and organized way

## Strategic writing is...

Determining the best way to complete a writing project with success.

A child who writes a lot and often in real life situations will practice more strategies and become a better writer.

As a parent, I should talk to my child and use some of the following questions, regardless of my level of understanding in French:

#### **BEFORE WRITING**

- What are you writing about today?
- Are you set up comfortably to write?
- Do you think you will have enough time to finish your writing project?
- For whom and why are you writing this text?
- What do you know already about this topic?
- Did you make a plan?

#### In a homework setting:

- Are you required to do a draft copy, revisions, corrections, a good copy?
- What tools can help you with this project?
- Do you have your *Référentiel*?
- What strategies have you used in the past to write something similar?

# DURING THE WRITING PROCESS

Who can help you?

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- Can you recall writing this type of text with success?
- What connections are you making between what you are writing and what you have read or experienced before?
- What important ideas should you make sure to include in your text?
- Is what you are writing truly what you want to say in this case?
- What strategies from your *Référentiel* can you use to help you with this problem?

## **AFTER WRITING**

- How do you feel after writing this text?
- What questions are you asking yourself right now?
- How helpful were the notes you took prior to writing?
- Did the strategies you used help you to write a better text?
- What strategies could you use in future writing projects?
- What will you do with this text now?
- Talk to me about how you feel about this writing project.

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
